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Shri D. M. Parate, Dy. R. (Acd) and Smt. A. A. Ansingkar, A.R. (Exams) were present in the meeting.

Dr. Yogesh Deshpande, Dr. I. K. Chopde, Dr. K. L. Thakre, Dr. G. N. Ronghe and Dr. C. S. Moghe sought leave of absence.

Mr. K. Darshan General Secretary, Mr. Avijit Bansal Secretary, Academic Affairs UG and Ms. Piyusha Hirpurkar Secretary, Academic Affairs PG from Students Council attended the meeting.

At the outset, the Chairman placed on record the active participation and contribution of Dr. A. G. Kothari, an outgoing member (retired) and Dr. R. M. Patrikar, former Dean (Acd).

The Chairman also welcomed Dr. O. R. Jaiswal, Dean (Acd) and the newly inducted members Dr. A. R. Tembhurkar, HoD, Civil, Dr. P. S. Deshpande, HoD, Computer Science & Engineering and Dr. A. B. Andhare, Faculty I/c T&P. The Chairman also welcomed the newly constituted Students Council members, Mr. K. Darshan General Secretary, Mr. Avijit Bansal Secretary, Academic Affairs UG and Ms. Piyusha Hirpurkar Secretary, Academic Affairs PG.

The House welcomed Dr. Narendra S. Chaudhari, Chairman Senate on his first Senate meeting after he took over the charge of the Director, VNIT Nagpur and also senate member Dr. Milind Atrey from IIT Bombay.

Students' representatives placed following points;

 Students unable to appear for end-semester examination due to medical emergency, be not rated FF grade.

The Senate had detailed discussion on earlier occasions. For want of proper quantification of medical emergency it was decided that the request of the students' representative cannot be accepted at this stage.

b) There shall be flexible academic curriculum for major-minor specialization.

c) A policy to help the student falling short of 6 credits.

The issues be referred to Dean (Acd) for consideration.

d) Inclusion of rating of extra-curriculum activities in Grade Card / Transcripts.

Senate members opined that since the extra-curricular activities do not fall in academic curriculum the request cannot be accepted.

e) Provision of remedial classes to academically weak students.

The Senate resolved that the Student's Council shall identify the senior students who would be able to take classes for academically weaker students. They may start this programme informally. Further the training programme to be arranged for UG Students during vacation shall remain optional and must be with precise objectives.

f) Help to M.Tech. / M.Sc. students for placement through Institute.

It was informed to the students representatives that the Companies do not visit the Institute exclusively for placement of PG students due to less number of students in PG programmes. Efforts are being made by the Institute for placement of PG students and the placement is progressing.

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g) Recommendation to PG students for further higher studies.

It was suggested that a good quality M.Tech. project work with good research paper output will help the students to opt for further higher studies.

The Senate deliberated the agenda and resolved as under;

S 31.01 To note and confirm the minutes of the 30th meeting of the Senate held on 11th May 2013.

Confirmed.

S 31.02 To note the Action Taken Report on decisions of the 29th meetings of the Senate.

Noted the action taken report with following suggestions;

- (i) In Academic Process Review (ref. 30.03) IISc shall be included alongwith IITs for peer review of B.Tech. / M.Tech. programme.
- (ii) Peer review shall be done "preferably" in the month of August.
- S 31.03 Approval of lists of students for conferment of degrees and awards.

Approved the list as proposed. Further, the Senate authorized the Chairman Senate to include the names of the scholars who will complete their Ph.D. successfully till 14th September 2013.

S 31.04 Academic Calendar for the session 2013-14.

The Senate deliberated the issue at length and suggested the Dean (Acd) to modify it suitably starting the next session from 1st January 2014 instead of 22nd December 2013. Possibility of conducting sessional exams on Saturdays be explored to squeeze the duration of semester.

S 31.05 Intellectual Property (IP) Policy for VNIT Nagpur.

The Senate resolved to circulate the draft policy to all faculty members to examine and discuss at department level and to give suggestions / comments on relevant points. The policy, duly revised may be placed for consideration in next Senate meeting.

S 31.06 Guidelines & Rules governing Ph.D. programmes.

The Senate approved the proposal with following modifications;

- a) Point 4.2 (4) may be read as "Minimum CGPA requirement for course work is 6.0".
- b) In Point 6, word "registrations" be replaced by "Extension of registration" and retention of registration fee be charged.
- S 31.07 Changes in B.Tech. and M.Tech. (CSE) Schemes.

Approved the schemes with suggestion to modify suitably 500 level courses in B.Tech. scheme.

S 31.08 Induction of new subjects (DE) in a B.Arch. and M.Tech. Urban Planning and also revise the course contents in two M.Tech. Urban Planning (DE) programme.

The Senate deliberate the issue and approved the induction of Built Environment – Behaviour Studies (DE) for B.Arch. course and RS & GIS Applications (DE) for M.Tech. Urban Planning. The Senate also accepted the revision of the course contents of M.Tech. Urban Planning in ARL516, Sustainable Development (DE) and ARL438, Urban Landscape (DE) as proposed.



(b) Mechanism to handle academically weak students.

Senate recommended that APPEC shall prepare a policy on lines with IIT Bombay and place the same in next Senate meeting for consideration.

(c) Relaxation in rules for continuing registration.

Senate resolved that the students seeking relaxation for the first time be considered by the APPEC and monitor their progress for one semester. The cases of students already availed relaxation earlier but could not succeed, shall be examined by APPEC on case-by-case basis.

(d) Permission to submit Ph.D. thesis after expiry of extended period.

Senate approved the request of Mr. Vishal V. Shukla to permit him to submit his Ph.D. thesis as a special case. However, he shall pay the requisite fees for re-registration etc.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks to the Chair.
